## **ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION**

This activity is designed for pharmacists and pharmacy technicians in all practice settings. Pharmacists can receive up to 6 contact hours (0.6 CEUs) and pharmacy technicians up to 4.5 contact hours (0.45 CEUs) of live continuing pharmacy education virtually via Zoom. The sessions will focus on precepting pharmacy students, pharmacy law, drug diversion, self-care, and vaccine hesitancy. The drug diversion session meets the two hour requirement for WVHB 4037 (Drug Diversion) or re-licensure by the West Virginia Board of Pharmacy.

## **ACCREDITATION**

- Identify the available opioid antagonist products currently available in the United States.
- Recall the proper administration of opioid antagonist medications for the reversal of opioid overdose respiratory depression.
